What does it mean to live with food insecurity?

When there isn't enough money, people are forced to use their food budget to pay other expenses. They resort to lownutrient food, emergency food services and/or skipping meals.

Food insecure individuals have a greater risk for:

- Poor physical health, chronic diseases and infections
- Mental health conditions such as depression and anxiety
- Injury
- Poor oral health
